Ms Moses joined the foreign service of Nauru in 1983. She served as Nauru's Consul in Japan (1988-1990), Consul-General in New Zealand (1991-1995) and Assistant Director in the Department of Foreign Affairs (1995-1996). She has held numerous other key positions in the Government of Nauru and in 2003 became Nauru's Permanent Representative to the United Nations in New York. From April 2009 to December 2011 she served as Chair of the Pacific Small Islands Developing States (PSIDS) at the United Nations and in January 2012 was elected Chair of the Alliance of Small Island States (AOSIS).
